



SERIES 1 OF DOGS BEHAVING (VERY) BADLY HEADS DOWN UNDER AFTER BEING PICKED UP BY AUSTRALIA'S SEVEN NETWORK

It was announced today (Monday 9th September) that Australia's Seven Network is the latest broadcaster to pick up the UK ratings hit series *Dogs Behaving (Very) Badly*. Made by indie Avalon, the series which is airing in a primetime slot, follows the work of the highly experienced dog behaviour expert, **Graeme Hall**.

Other networks who have already acquired the successful show include Germany's ProSiebenSat.1, Sweden's TV4, Finland's YLE, Norway's TV2 and Belgium's SBS.

The series which originally aired on Channel 5 in the UK at the start of 2019, with a series high of 1.5m (8.1%) after five episodes, follows Graeme Hall AKA 'The Dogfather' as he travels across Britain to help out of control dogs and their desperate owners – transforming their home life in the process. Graeme meets three tricky dogs in each episode and uses his tried and tested techniques to fix their behaviour in record time. His mantra is simple, *"Any Dog, Any Age, Any Problem."*

Armed with over 10 years of training, the equivalent of approx. 70 dog years, Graeme has helped train over 4,800 canines and their owners. Getting the problem fixed quickly and getting it right first time, he has gained a unique reputation within his profession. With his specific approach of combining knowledge and understanding, he gets the results *the owners* want for *their* dogs. That's more than knowledge – it's a *feel* for dogs.

Announcing the deal, Isobel Hughes, Director of Distribution at Avalon, said: *"It's really great to have Seven Network and other leading international broadcasters get behind this hit series following its instant success on Channel 5 in the UK at the start of 2019."*
